

Ash Wednesday 2021 Collection

On Ash Wednesday, February 17, our diocese will take up the collection for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe. This will help fund grants that provide pastoral care, affordable shelter, and a cultural and spiritual education for suffering people who live in areas formerly under Soviet control. The U.S. bishops take up the collection as a way for Catholics in the United States to stand in solidarity with those who experience the ongoing effects of communism. The bishops and people of these regions face the enormous task of restoring church structures while rebuilding the life of the community. In order for these vital projects to continue, the collection needs your help. Your generosity and donation will help restore the Church and build the future of Central & Eastern Europe. ASH WEDNESDAY INSTRUCTIONS: Here is the instruction for the distribution of ashes from the Congregation of Divine Worship: The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments issued this instruction for the distribution of ashes for Ash Wednesday during this Covid-19 pandemic time: After blessing the ashes, then sprinkling them with holy water in silence, the priest addresses those present, *reciting once* the formula found in the Roman Missal: “Repent, and believe in the Gospel” or “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”

- At that point, the note continues, the priest “cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places.” He then sprinkles the ashes on each person’s head “*without saying anything.*”
- Note that the formula is said only once. To avoid any touching of foreheads, the congregation says the priest “sprinkles ashes on each person’s head.”
- That procedure is the custom in Europe and many other parts of the world. In the United States the custom has been to impose the ashes on the forehead. However, the Roman Missal itself only says: “the priest places ashes on the head.” So, this year in this time of the pandemic, the custom of sprinkling ashes on the head will be used instead of imposing ashes on the forehead.

The above instructions will be used as the manner of distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday, February 17th, here at Our Lady of Tahoe Catholic parish. The Masses will be celebrated at 9am and 5:30pm on that day. Please remember to call the office to reserve your place. Social distancing will apply as you come forward by sections to receive your ashes as you do at communion time.
