Mary's presentation was celebrated in Jerusalem in the sixth century. A church was built there in honor of this mystery. The Eastern Church was more interested in the feast, but it does appear in the West in the 11th century. Although the feast at times disappeared from the calendar, in the 16th century it became a feast of the universal Church. As with Mary's birth, we read of Mary's presentation in the temple only in apocryphal literature. In what is recognized as an unhistorical account, the *Protoevangelium of James* tells us that Anna and Joachim offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was 3 years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was still childless. Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond. **Reflection:** It is sometimes difficult for modern Westerners to appreciate a feast like this. The Eastern Church, however, was quite open to this feast and even somewhat insistent about celebrating it. Even though the feast has no basis in history, it stresses an important truth about Mary: From the beginning of her life, she was dedicated to God. She herself became a greater temple than any made by hands. God came to dwell in her in a marvelous manner and sanctified her for her unique role in God's saving work. At the same time, the magnificence of Mary enriches her children. They—we—too are temples of God and sanctified in order that we might enjoy and share in God's saving work.



The month of November, we remember the Holy Souls in purgatory and pray for all the aborted babies and the mothers who are deceased as a result of an abortion procedure. Liturgy of the Word #2 – The First Reading

“The New Testament lies hidden in the Old and the Old Testament is unveiled in the New.” Catechism of the Catholic Church 129

On Sundays outside of Easter, the First Reading is taken from the Old Testament and is used specifically because it has a connection to the Gospel. This is important for two reasons. First, because it shows the consistency of God's plan of salvation throughout the millennia. God isn't going to change His mind tomorrow and unveil a new savior or a new Bible. Rather, throughout all time He has been preparing us for Jesus, and with Christ's arrival, we have encountered the fullness of divine revelation. Second, the Old Testament gives us a context from which we can understand what Jesus is saying to us. Oftentimes, Christ said things that were difficult to interpret, and at times even the Apostles didn't understand what Jesus was saying. But by looking back into the Old Testament, we have a tool to help guide us into a knowledge of Christ's words and deeds. What is your favorite Old Testament story?

As disciples of Jesus Christ, and in the name of Mary, Our Lady of Tahoe Catholic community welcomes and embraces all those who come to us. With guidance of the Holy Spirit, through worship, the sacraments, and loving service, we provide for one another's spiritual and material needs. 
It's Time for Our Annual Parish Christmas Party!
