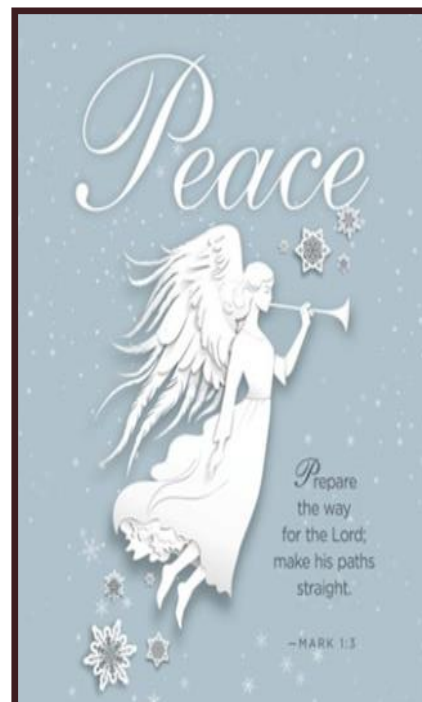

Holy Day of Obligation



"The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin." In 1854, Pope Pius IX's solemn declaration, "Ineffabilis Deus," clarified with finality the long-held belief of the Church that Mary was conceived free from original sin. Mary was granted this extraordinary privilege because of Her unique role in history as the Mother of God. That is, she received the gift of salvation in Christ from the very moment of her conception. Even though Mary is unique in all humanity for being born without sin, she is held up by the Church as a model for all humanity in Her holiness and Her purity in her willingness to accept the Plan of God for her. Every person is called to recognize and respond to God's call to their own vocation in order to carry out God's plan for their life and fulfill the mission prepared for them since before the beginning of time. Mary's "Let it be done to me according to Thy Word," in response of the Angel Gabriel's greeting, is the response required of all Christians to God's Plan. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a time to celebrate the great joy of God's gift to humanity in Mary, and to recognize with greater clarity, the truth that each and every human being has been created by God to fulfill a particular mission that he and only he can fulfill. "The word of the Lord came to me thus: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you." (Jeremiah 1:5-6)

A message from Bishop Mueggenborg:

Across the United States, hundreds of religious communities - Priests, Brothers, Sisters, and Nuns - lack financial resources to meet the retirement and healthcare needs of aging members. Many elder religious spent their youth working for small stipends, with little for retirement savings. Simultaneously the decrease in religious vocations means that few religious are able to serve in compensated ministry. Today, retired religious outnumber wage-earners by three to one. The Retirement Fund for Religious (RFR) attempts to provide for those religious who gave their lives to the church. Most donations to the RFR are distributed as Direct Care Assistance, going to individual religious for immediate eldercare needs or saved for long-term expenses. Nearly 25,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests benefit annually from this fund. Roughly 95% of the RFR budget aides senior religious. The remainder is used for administration of the funds and promotion of the nationwide RFR appeal. Donating to this fund is a great way to help the growing number of elderly who, due to their service to God, were unable to save for their retirement.

Liturgy of the Word #4 – Second Reading

"The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you." John 14:26 NIV

The Second Reading is always taken from the New Testament and is read in what is known as a "semi-continuous" manner. This is to say, over the course of a few Sundays, the Church will read through a single book of the New Testament, and when we get to the end of that book, we switch to another book of the New Testament. Because of this, the Second Reading usually will not have the same theme as the other readings at that particular Mass. Instead, it will focus on some important theological points. The Second Reading is, in a sense, a theological lesson on what living a life of faith entails. What is your favorite New Testament passage? In what ways do you see yourself resembling St. Paul?

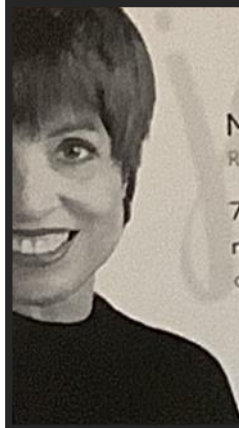
