
PALM SUNDAY of the Passion of the Lord

Holy Week Schedule:

<u>Palm Sunday</u> – Saturday at 5pm/ Sunday at 8am and 11:30am. (Palms will be blessed and distributed). The Passion of the Lord is read at the Gospel time.

<u>Wednesday of Holy Week</u> – Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confessions) at 11am followed by mass at 11:30am.

<u>Thursday – Holy Thursday</u> – Celebration of the Lord's Supper – Mass is at 7pm only! A time of adoration of the Lord in the Tabernacle after mass is permitted.

<u>Friday – Good Friday</u> – Stations of the Cross in Church at 12 Noon. Celebration of the Lord's Passion at 3pm. – Liturgy of the Word, Adoration of the Cross, Holy Communion. (Not a Mass).

Saturday – Easter Vigil Mass – begins at 7:45pm in the HALL where we gather and prepare our candles for the Blessing of the Paschal Fire (outside in the walkway), Procession to the church, Exultet, Readings, Blessing of the Easter Water, Renewal of our Baptismal Vows, Blessing with the Easter Water, Mass continues as usual. (NO 5pm Mass this day).

Easter Sunday - MASS AT 10AM ONLY!!!!

PLEASE come to the Easter Vigil on Saturday! It is the Church's highest and most important liturgy of the entire year! Please come to Easter Sunday even if you came to the Vigil! I want to see a fully packed church that morning!

Eucharistic Prayer #4 – The Eucharistic Actions

"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'Take and eat; this is my body." Matthew 26:26 NIV

At the Last Supper, Christ did four things: He took the bread, He blessed it/gave thanks, He broke it, and He gave it to His disciples. The Priest will say these words at every Mass right before the Words of Institution-a reminder that Christ is the one acting. However, while the words are said, these actions are also done: in the offertory the bread is taken by Christ, in the Eucharistic Prayer He blesses it and changes it into His own body, in the fraction rite He breaks the host in two reminding us of His death, and during the distribution of communion gives His body to us. As such, the entirety of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is a recapitulation of the actions of Christ at the Last Supper. Some commentators also argue that what happens to the bread that is offered also happens to the congregation. How are you taken, blessed, broken, and given?



From Bishop Daniel Mueggenborg -

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On this Good Friday, Christians turn their attention especially to the Holy Land and its place in salvation history. 
