Praise the Holy Trinity

Some truths, like the very existence of God, can be known by human reason alone. Other truths, like the fact that God is One in Three Persons - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – can only be known if God reveals them to us. We could never conclude on our own that God is a Trinity. Today's Feast is not only an opportunity for thanking God for telling us more about himself. It is an occasion to take courage as we strive for deeper unity within the human family. God reveals himself to us in order to make us more like himself not just as individuals, but as families, nations, and an international community. We grow in unity as we give ourselves away to one another, just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit give themselves to each other completely.

In the 12th century in the French region of Premontre, Saint Norbert founded a religious Order known as the Praemonstratensians or the Norbertines. His founding of the Order was a monumental tasks: combating rampant heresies particularly regarding the Blessed Sacrament, revitalizing many of the faithful who had grown indifferent and dissolute, plus effecting peace and reconciliation among enemies. Norbert entertained no pretensions about his own ability to accomplish this multiple task. Even with the aid of a goodly number of men who joined his Order, he realized that nothing could be effectively done without God's power. Finding this help especially in devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, he and his Norbertines praised God for success in converting heretics, reconciling numerous enemies, and rebuilding faith in indifferent believers. Many of them lived in central houses during the week and served in parishes on weekends. Reluctantly, Norbert became archbishop of Magdeburg in central Germany, a territory half pagan and half Christian. In this position he zealously and courageously continued his work for the Church until his death on June 6, 1134. **Reflection:** A different world cannot be built by indifferent people. The same is true in regard to the Church. The indifference of vast numbers of nominal faithful to ecclesiastical authority and essential doctrines of the faith weakens the Church's witness. Unswerving loyalty to the Church and fervent devotion to the Eucharist, as practiced by Norbert, will continue immeasurably toward maintaining the people of God in accord with the heart of Christ.

From the Bishop's Office/Faith Formation Announcement...

After much prayer, I have decided in consultation with the Priests Council, parish Directors of Religious Education and Youth Ministers that the normal age of Confirmation in the Diocese of Reno will move from tenth grade or the equivalent age to seventh grade or the equivalent age. In making this change, we are joining a growing trend of dioceses who are doing the same. Principle changes: The new normal age of Confirmation as seventh grade or the equivalent age, which allows any catechized seventh grader to present himself or herself for Confirmation. Clarification regarding the role of Catholic Schools in sacramental catechetical preparation that encourages collaboration between the parish and school community. A focus on family catechesis, which will empower parents to foster their children's faith and assist them to encounter Christ as they participate in the life of the parish.

<u>Eucharistic Prayer #13 – The Great Amen</u>

"Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your 'Amen' may ring true!"

St. Augustine Sermon 272

The final statement of the laity in the Eucharistic Prayer is the Great Amen. Amen is a Hebrew word which is very difficult to translate. Roughly it means "so be it" or "I agree completely," but it also has the connotation of existential investment, such that one can translate it as "I pledge my life to this." Because of this, the Great Amen is the moment in which we give our own personal ascent to all that has happened in the Mass and we pledge our lives to God in and through the Eucharist.
