Taking the Parable of the Two Sons at face value, we can see that both sons act poorly. But the first son changed his mind after telling the father he wouldn't help him, and ultimately, he did the will of his father. The second son only paid lip service by saying 'Yes' initially, but he had no action and no repentance. Our turning to God with repentance is the key to our salvation, no matter what our past sins might be or how many times we've disappointed God. One of the beautiful things about God is his enduring grace, forgiveness, and love for His people. He doesn't give up on us, even when our backs are turned to Him and we keep telling Him 'No'. He patiently waits for the 'Yes'. We are all His children, beloved and welcomed to join His Kingdom for eternity. He's waiting with open arms and there's room enough for all of us.



The Story of the Feast of the Guardian Angels

Perhaps no aspect of Catholic piety is as comforting to parents as the belief that an angel protects their little ones from dangers real and imagined. Yet guardian angels are not only for children. Their role is to represent individuals before God, to watch over them always, to aid their prayer, and to present their souls to God at death. The concept of an angel assigned to guide and nurture each human being is a development of Catholic doctrine and piety based on Scripture but not directly drawn from it. Jesus' words in Matthew 18:10 best support the belief: "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father." Devotion to the angels began to develop with the birth of the monastic tradition. Saint Benedict gave it impetus and Saint Bernard of Clairvaux, the great 12th-century reformer, was such an eloquent spokesman for the guardian angels that angelic devotion assumed its current form in his day. A feast in honor of the guardian angels was first observed in the 16th century. In 1615, Pope Paul V added it to the Roman calendar. Reflection -Devotion to the angels is, at base, an expression of faith in God's enduring love and providential care extended to each person day in and day out.

Communion Rites #7 - Distribution of Communion

"If you, therefore, are Christ's body and members, it is your own mystery that is placed on the Lord's table! It is your own mystery that you are receiving! You are saying 'Amen' to what you are: your response is a personal signature, affirming your faith. When you hear 'The body of Christ', you reply 'Amen.' Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your 'Amen' may ring true!" St. Augustine, Sermon

In our reception of the Eucharist, we receive who we are and we become what we receivewe are united with Jesus such that we are the Body of Christ (1 Cor 12:27), and in the Eucharist we receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus. But St. Paul reminds us over and over again that we must be fully prepared to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, and that failure to do so cuts us off from Christ (c.f. 1 Cor 11:27 & 29). Which is to say, the Eucharist is not a prize for good behavior, but an identity we must live. And so the words of St. Augustine are particularly appropriate: "Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your 'Amen' may ring true!" How are you being the body of Christ out in the world? How do you give due reverence to Jesus in the Eucharist?
